Paper 3: Reading (25%) SECTION A: Questions to be answered in English SECTION B Questions to be answered in French SECTION C Translation from French into English Paper 4: Writing (25%) The writing exam is divided into 4 elements: Photocard (4 short sentences), writing a short passage (40 word task), translation from English into French and an extended writing task (90 word task). Pupils study 3 main themes, sub divided into topics. Pupils will be assessed on all themes across listening, speaking reading and writing. Theme 1: Identity & Culture (<i>Me, my family & friends, technology in everyday life, free time activities and customs & festivals in French speaking countries & communities.</i>) Theme 2: Local, national, international and global areas of interest (<i>Home town, neighbourhood and region, social and global issues, travel & tourism.</i>) Theme 3: Current & future study & employment (<i>My studies, life at school, education post 16, Jobs, career choice & ambitions.</i>)
