This half term, the children will be discussing how to be safe online with the focus of 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online' as part of Safer Internet Day (7<sup>th</sup> February). We will also be completing work as part of Children's Mental Health Week (6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> February).

## **School Council and Junior Road Safety Officers**

Mrs Smith and the School Council have been hard at work and they organised the Children in Need day in the primary phase in November. We raised a massive £342 as a whole school and the children loved the exciting activities that the School Council organised. Well done everyone!

The Junior Road Safety Officers have been working hard on the Active Travel Award Scheme and have been busy handing out badges every month. In December, we received an update on how much impact the scheme is already having and we are pleased to share with you the following results!

Our Active Travel rate is 71% against a baseline of 34% - an increase of 109%

Our Walking rate is 32% compared to the baseline of 27% - an increase of 19%

Our Park & Stride rate is 36% compared to the baseline of 5% - an increase of 620%

Our **Driven** rate is **27%** compared to the baseline of 65% - a decrease of **58%**.

Please keep supporting us with the scheme by encouraging everyone to actively travel to school!

#### Uniform

A reminder that due to Health and Safety in school, earrings are not allowed. Please ensure that your child removes their earrings and replaces them with clear retainers before they come to school. Plasters over the ears will not be acceptable. Failure to do so may lead to the child missing PE. A reminder that school hoodies must only be worn on PE/sports club days and not every day. Nail polish/false nails are not allowed.

### Milk and snack

Milk is available from Cool Milk and information is available by contacting the school. Milk cannot be brought into school from home. Tuck shop is open for healthy snack (breadsticks and Snack-a-jacks) and items costs 25p. If you are sending in a snack from home, please ensure it is healthy e.g. fruit. Fruit is provided for Reception and KS1 (Years 1 and 2) as part of a government scheme. Please ensure your child brings a filled water bottle (water only please) into school daily for throughout the day.
