Topics

Homework/Reading

Homework will be sent home via dojo every Friday. You will find the homework on the class story. Please can the children complete either the English grammar homework or the Maths task the following Wednesday. You can send your class teacher a photo of the completed homework or children can write their answers on paper and they can bring this with them to school.

If your child is struggling with anything, then feel free to write a comment on the sheet to let us know of any difficulties.

Children will be rewarded with a dojo for bringing homework back on time.

It is important for children to read to an adult at home daily. Reading will be rewarded with air miles and these will be checked off in school. Children will also receive a dojo for each time they read at home, as well as an entry into our class reading raffle to win a prize each week.

Regular practise on Times Table Rockstars and Numbots will really help to improve your child's Maths skills.

Uniform

Please see the website for a correct list of the school uniform. School uniform is expected to be worn every day apart from the days your child does PE (see below for more details).

PE

Our PE day this half term is on Monday week A and Thursday week B. Swimming/PE will be every Wednesday afternoon until the 31st January (This date is our final session). On the Wednesday swimming day children to come to school in their uniform with swimming kit in a separate bag. Please ensure your child comes to school in the correct kit. Please see the school website for the correct kit. Children can wear tracksuits if the weather is an issue – please be aware that PE lessons may take place outside so correct kit including appropriate footwear is essential.

Earrings/piercing

Due to Health & Safety in school, earrings/piercings are not allowed. Please ensure that your child removes their earrings or clear retainers before they come to school. Plasters over the ears will not be acceptable. Failure to do so may lead to the child missing PE and break times.
