School Uniform

Mid-grey trousers, shorts or skirt.

Long or short sleeved white shirt

Clip-on or elastic school tie

Navy blue v-neck sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan with school logo.

Black shoes

Grey or white socks or grey tights.

Summer uniform – Navy blue and white gingham dress.

PE uniform

Trainers (not pumps)

Navy blue shorts or a plain navy blue tracksuit may be worn for outdoor PE.

White t-shirt (polo or round neck)

Due to Health and Safety in school, <u>metal earrings are not allowed</u>. Please ensure that your child removes their metal earrings before they come to school. Plasters over the ears will not be acceptable.

If you wish your child to wear earrings, clear plastic earrings are allowed as they do not rip the ear if accidentally pulled. However, **these cannot be worn for PE** so the child must be able to remove them. Staff are not allowed to remove earrings.








Young Voices

The JRSO's also give out the badges for the Walk to School initiative. In December, we were informed of the following:

As at 8/12/24 (and compared to your baseline figures):

Your Active Travel rate was 34% and is now 76% - a rise of 124% (highest rise in the region!)

Your walking rate was 27% and is now 32% - a rise of 19%

Your Park and Stride rate was 5% and is now 38% - a rise of 660% !!

Your driven-all-the-way rate was 65% and is now 23% - a reduction of 65%

Well done everyone! Keep walking, cycling, scootering and Park and Stride to get to school!
