

Holy Trinity Sports Premium Funding



What is the Sports Premium?

Sports Premium funding is allocated by the government and aimed at making additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport in primary schools, so that all pupils are encourage to develop healthy and active lifestyles.

For the academic year 2023-2024, Holy Trinity has been allocated £19430 (£19440 in 2022-23). This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools; however individual schools have the freedom to decide how they do this.
