SATs

Well done to all our Year 6 pupils who took their SATs last half term. They worked so hard and both classes had full attendance for the tests which is excellent!

This half term is the Phonics Check in Year 1 (and recheck in Year 2 for those who didn't score the required amount in Year 1) and the Multiplication Check in Year 4.

Transition

Children will be moving up to meet their new class teachers on the 3rd and 4th July. More details will be sent out nearer the time outlining which class will have which teacher. However, on these days, children will come into school and go out in the normal way with their current class teachers and will meet their new teacher once they have registered in their current class. Uniform

Please ensure correct uniform is worn to school (including ties which can be purchased from the Main Reception) and the correct PE kit. These are clearly displayed on our website. A reminder that due to Health and Safety in school, earrings are not allowed. Please ensure that your child removes their earrings and replaces them with clear retainers before they come to school. Plasters over the ears will not be acceptable. Clear retainers are not allowed in PE. A reminder that school hoodies must only be worn on PE/sports club days and not every day. Nail polish/false nails are not allowed.

To support with uniform, we have a rail of good quality second hand uniform in the primary reception. All items are **free!** More is put out daily – please ask if there is something specific you require.

Absence/Attendance

A polite reminder to please inform school (via the Gateway app or by phone 01227 704550) of your child's absence **for each day** they are off. This saves us then having to call you to find out why your child is not in school. Please do not use Class Dojo for this as the teachers are teaching and may not see your message. A reminder that school starts at 8:45 for Nursery and Reception and 8:55am for Years 1-6.

Milk and snack

Milk is available from Cool Milk and information is available by contacting the school. Milk cannot be brought into school from home. Tuck shop is open for healthy snack (breadsticks and Snack-a-jacks) and items costs 25p. If you are sending in a snack from home, please ensure it is healthy e.g. fruit. Fruit is provided for Reception and KS1 (Years 1 and 2) as part of a government scheme. Please ensure your child brings a filled water bottle (water only please) into school daily for throughout the day.
